**CONTOURITES** This is the primary meeting for all those interested in the fast-moving and interdisciplinary field of contourites and associated deepwater processes and sediments. We already have a fantastic line-up of speakers, posters, workshops and discussion sessions. Join us in Edinburgh, May 24-26th 2023.

**VENUE** The Royal Society of Edinburgh (24-25<sup>th</sup>) on George Street in the heart of Edinburgh's city centre, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and Heriot-Watt University, Riccarton Campus (26<sup>th</sup>) for workshops and discussion sessions. Edinburgh is a beautiful and historic city, so do plan to include some tourism time.

#### **ACCOMMODATION**

There is no designated conference hotel, but there are many hotels, guesthouses and Airbnb options available in Edinburgh. See: <a href="https://www.google.com/travel/hotels/Edinburgh">https://www.google.com/travel/hotels/Edinburgh</a>

We do not in any way recommend one hotel or option over another. However, some guidelines are as follows:

**City Centre:** The venue for the first two days is the Royal Society of Edinburgh on George Street – nearby hotels include: Novotel, Premier Inn, Mercure, Ibis Styles (lower cost), Le Monde, Malmaison, Old Waverley (mid-cost), and Sonder Royal Garden or The Edinburgh Grand (higher cost). There are also many other hotels in the area, and lots of Airbnb too. Edinburgh Central Youth Hostel is another low-cost option near the city centre.


**Further out:** Hotels tend to be lower cost just outside the central area. There is a good bus network everywhere so not really a problem if you're a little out of the centre. The Shore in Leith has a Malmaison, Holiday Inn, as well as luxury hotels on converted ships (Fingal and Ocean Mist), and many more Airbnb's and smaller guesthouses. **On campus (Heriot Watt University)**: The venue for the Friday discussion workshops is the Lyell Centre on the University campus. Lothian buses (25 and 34) from the city centre (30 minutes). Alternatively, there is a campus hotel – The Courtyard by Marriott (Edinburgh West), as well as lower-cost accommodation (see below).

**Lower-cost option:** We have reserved a number of rooms on campus in the Paul Stobart Building near the Edinburgh Business School, Heriot Watt University. These are £70 per night, for single or double occupancy (no breakfast included). Reserve via and for any further information **d.stow@hw.ac.uk** 

#### **TRANSPORT**

Convenient and safe transport is available throughout the city.

**Airport:** Edinburgh Airport (10 km west) is served by airport buses (No 100 to the City Centre), trams and taxis. **Trains:** Edinburgh Waverley Station is located in the City Centre. Edinburgh Haymarket Station is 1 km west. **Trams** run from the Airport to the City. **Buses** are frequent and with many Lothian Bus services that criss-cross the city. **Taxis:** black cabs can be picked up anywhere; several private companies operate by hire. Uber is also available.



#### **CONFERENCE PROGRAMME**

- Bottom currents complexities and controls, eddies and benthic storms, internal tides

- Process interaction downslope and alongslope processes, hybrid deposits
- Gateways and controls sediment budgets, contourite cyclicity, organic carbon
- Seismics and subsurface sequence stratigraphy, petrophysics and image logs
- Significance paleoceanography and climate, slope stability and tsunamigenesis, reservoirs and source rocks, bio-diversity and socio-economic impact

- 25<sup>th</sup> Conference Dinner the Heights, Apex Grassmarket Hotel, Grassmarket (free to all participants)

- Deep Ocean Drilling: an IODP workshop with a focus on Pacific Ocean targets

#### **FIELD TRIPS**

**Pre-conference excursion 18-23 May: Scottish geo-transect** from Edinburgh to the western isles – principal geotectonics and sedimentary successions of Scotland, castles, lochs and scenery.


Evening tour 24th May: Building Stones of Edinburgh (two hours, free), City of Edinburgh.


